Spokane Police Department is again hosting the "Enhancing the Survival Mindset" class for the community. The class is designed to provide a safe place for women and teen girls to learn the basics of self-defense and situational awareness. The course consists of a classroom portion where participants will receive information on crime statistics, situational awareness, and survival mindset. Hands-on training introduces participants to defensive tactic techniques and places participants into realistic threat scenarios. Afterward, participants de-brief the situations with officers and process potential options and different ways of responding to similar threats. Attendees must be at least middle school aged accompanied by an adult to participate. The charge for this class is \$25.
