STA Plaza to Host Downtown Library During Renovation

Last November, voters overwhelmingly approved the Spokane Public Library bond measure to remodel four existing libraries and build three new libraries. In early spring 2020, the Downtown Library will close for two years while it undergoes significant renovations.

To continue offering essential library services in the downtown core, the Library partnered with Spokane Transit Authority (STA) and entered into a lease agreement to temporarily relocate some of its Downtown Library services and staff to the second floor of the STA Plaza while renovations are made to the Downtown Library. The Library plans to begin tenant improvements in the temporary space in December to be ready for its public opening on March 2, 2020.

Spokane Public Library, Shadle Branch, will be located at the Northtown Mall at 4750 North Division starting January 2, 2020 (Located at the Buffalo Wild Wings entrance next to Kohls and across from the Blue Zoo). The location will offer a curated collection of books, music, DVDs and computer access as well as a children's and teen section. Customers will also be able to pick up holds.

Neighborhood cleanup – this will be the last year that each neighborhood will be given \$7500, it goes back to \$6500 starting in 2021 (grant has been spent) The neighborhood cleanup meeting is Thursday Feb 27th from 6-7pm there will be some changes to the program activities and applications from neighborhoods will be available that night and need to be submitted by April 1st.

New design guidelines update- Dean Gunderson said there would be workshops in March and April and then June/July to talk about the relationship of new building in neighborhoods...not traffic related but how new buildings are connected to surrounds. Clarifying question answered- this affects the entire city not just downtown.

There was quite a bit of lively conversation and finally a motion proposal regarding Leadership training budget for neighborhood council members. topics for training were conflict resolution, dealing with difficult people and topics, community empowerment, etc. the motion was **passed** to earmark \$4000 from the community Engagement Grant for the purpose of training/education for the Community Assembly and Neighborhood Councils to be determined by recommendation by BSN. In the case that no training/education is identified in round 1.
