AT THE MARKET

EBT can be redeemed from Quest Cards at the Info Booth in \$1 increments in the form of an "EBT Token". EBT Tokens can be spent on breads, fruits, vegetables, cheese, milk & other dairy products, honey, eggs, seeds, plants that produce food and most other food items that are **not sold as prepared hot foods**. No change permitted and can not be split between vendors. *This year our EBT Match program has increased by 80%!! Those who use their EBT at EGFM also get SNAP Market Match Dollars. For each dollar distributed as an EBT Token, the purchaser will receive a matched amount in SNAP Market Match \$1 bills. which can be spent on Fruits, Vegetables, Mushrooms, Herbs, and edible plants. (NOTE: SMM can not purchase the following: Honey, Eggs, Breads, Dairy, hot prepared foods.)*

WIC Checks are orange and can be used for produce. Senior Checks are gray/green and can be used for produce or honey. Vendors who accept WIC & Senior Checks must have a blue sign posted at their booth. WIC & Senior Checks are valid starting June 1, 2020 and are issued in \$4.00 increments. They can not be split between vendors and change is not permitted.

Senior FMNP is available to low-income seniors. To qualify, you must be 60 or older and have an annual income below 185% of the Federal Poverty Level. You can use your Senior FMNP checks to buy fresh fruits, vegetables, herbs, and honey at farmers markets. If you are interested in applying for Senior FMNP, please call Senior Information and Services at (206) 448-3110.

Community Engagement Grant Details: PLEASE READ ATTACHED GUIDELINES/METRICS Each qualifying NC may apply for up to \$700 in the first round. Reallocation, applied for in the initial application, may be applied for up to an additional \$300, though there is no guarantee these funds will be available nor in the increment stated.

Important dates:

- September 21, 2020 All receipts from initial grant expenditures and all City inter-fund orders are due
- September 28, 2020 Budget Committee determines reallocation of remaining funds
- September 28 through November 13, 2020 NCs and CA Committees spend reallocated funds and deliver all receipts and orders to ONS by 5:00pm on November 13, 2020.

Grant funds cannot support software licenses, Website Domains, Clothing, Specialized Software, purchase of equipment, prizes and other giveaways, gifts, or food. School fees for janitors or other reasons are *not an allowable expense*.

The deadline to submit the application was extended for the Community Engagement Grant. We have a lot of options of what we could do with the funds. At the May 2020 meeting we discussed the following options:

- 1. A driveway event working with partners to distribute needed services.
- 2. Banners, sandwich boards, and other print materials.

3. Branded items for a neighborhood booth that could be used at the Farmer's Market as well as other community events.

4. Online advertising.

5. Direct mailing to 99205 residents advertising the neighborhood council and perhaps also the Farmer's Market. Taylor will research our options for having a drive away event, partnerships, and how we could advertise this with funds.

6. Hiring a graphic designer to create a brochure that includes all aspects of the neighborhood, including the Council, Farmer's Market, annual events, Business District, etc.

Taylor will look further into what we can spend our money on, such as contracting with a designer.

Traffic Calming Application for Emerson/Garfield: Submitted

Priority one involves the Washington/Buckeve intersection and priority two involves implementing a greenway. The application was approved by the neighborhood council with 21 approvals and no objections.

Clean Up Program: Submitted

Due to Covid19, the traditional Clean Up Program has been cancelled and instead the City is mailing every resident a \$20 dump pass this year, like around the beginning of June. These dump passes CAN be combined - so if you have neighbors who are not going to use theirs you can ask them to give theirs to you and "stack them". There will not be any dump passes available at the Farmer's Market this year due to this change in the program as a response to Covid19.

Community Development Block Grant (District 3): Submitted

The District 3 neighborhoods will be meeting to decide how to allocate the money - to date they have not completed the district vote. EGNC voted to make the Derelict Housing Acquisition Rehab program as our first priority project and the EduCare Roof Replacement as our second priority – 14 approvals and one abstention.

Neighborhood Gateway Sign with North Hill (District 3): Submitted
