CHHS is just wrapping up the procurement process to hire a landscape architect to design the North Hill and Emerson Garfield Neighborhood sign. CHHS provided the Community Assembly with an updated project summary spreadsheet in the January 3, 2019 [CA Packet](#) (see page 50). In that spreadsheet CHHS noted that we are in the process of procuring an architect.

Katie (ONS) will be in contact with both neighborhood councils after the procurement has been completed. Please review the monthly CA packet for a description of our progress with this (and other neighborhood) project. We have committed to this reporting format at the request of the CA/CD Committee.

Below is a sample of the scope of work we are using to procure the landscape architect.

SCOPE OF WORK:

The City of Spokane is seeking an architect who will develop the design and construction documents for one (1) entrance sign for the North Hill and Emerson Garfield neighborhood. The design and construction documents will be used for a future procurement for the build of the entrance sign. The font used for the entrance sign must be simple and readable, and the sign must require little- to- no maintenance.

The awarded architect is required to have pre-conference meeting with the City of Spokane's Community Housing & Human Services department to discuss this project in more detail. The awarded Contractor will meet with the North Hill and Emerson Garfield neighborhood councils a minimum of three (3) times to include a preliminary discussion on design ideas and concepts, adjustments to concept design, and to get consensus approval of the final design.
