- **Disposal Pass Update for NCs:** The City's spring disposal pass distribution has concluded, but residents will have another opportunity this fall. Beginning August 4, neighborhood councils may distribute physical \$30 disposal passes valid at the Waste to Energy Facility through October 31. The expanded fall program was developed in response to neighborhood feedback requesting additional support for yard waste disposal and more local distribution opportunities through neighborhood events and activities.
